

Q&A for Enrollment

1. I need to enroll my child/children in Lafourche Parish, where do I go?
 - All enrollment is handled at the individual school. Please check the school's website for address and contact numbers as well as other pertinent information.
2. We just moved here, how do I know which school my child/children will attend?
 - If you are not sure, visit the School Boundary Map listed on this website for assistance. To locate the correct middle or high school on the boundary map, click "content" in the upper left to switch the map options. Middle schools are for grades 6-8 and high schools are for grades 9-12. Search the address in the upper right, once the location appears, move the mouse slightly off the mark and click. This will indicate the proper school of enrollment. ONLY LAFOURCHE RESIDENTS CAN ENROLL IN LAFOURCHE PARISH PUBLIC SCHOOLS.
3. What do I need for enrollment?
 - Birth certificate
 - Updated immunization record
 - Social Security Card
 - Prior school records/information
 - 2 proofs of residency in the parent/legal guardian's name
 - Proof of guardianship (custody papers and/or any court/legal document if one is in place)
4. What are the types of "proof" of residency required? (Policy JBCC)
 - Lease, rental agreement, home mortgage/purchase deed in the parent/legal guardian's name
 - Property tax statement showing homestead exemption
 - Current utility bills (electricity, water, gas, sewerage, cable, land line-phone or wired internet)
 - Most recent income tax returns (Federal or State)
 - Any other documentation stipulated by the Superintendent
5. I don't have residency in my name because my child/children and I are living with someone else. What do I?
 - Report to the school to determine if a Proof of Residency form will be required. The school will provide the form if necessary and the homeowner and parent will have the form completed and notarized. The completed form should be sent to the School Board Office for approval.
6. My child/children will be living with a family member/friend and I will NOT be living with them, what do I need to do?
 - You will need to obtain a Provisional Custody from a notary IF there is no court judgement in place giving the other person custody. Provisional Custody is temporary custody issued for one school year and must be renewed every August. The original paperwork should be submitted to the school.
